
The United States of War: 2001-2021

Since 2001 US troops have fought in 25 countries. An estimated 4.5 million people have died in the 5 most violent wars, with tens of millions injured. 38 million have been displaced. 1.2 billion metric tons of greenhouse gases were emitted by the military. \$8 trillion is the cost, to now, to US taxpayers, amid \$14 trillion in total military spending. The wars were enabled by 2,000+ military bases overseas. There are still 750 bases in 80 countries. The wars are ongoing in Syria, Yemen, Somalia, + beyond.






How Would We Feel? A Hypothetical Map




Enabling Wars in the Middle East
